For plants, I'm a big fan of Morth Hill Musteries in Chobham, Survey, (01276) 858800. They grow their own trees, some 125 varieties, as well as chimbing plants, shrubs and hostas - a big feature in my Chelsea show garden this year.

WHAT ARE YOUR FAVOURITE PLANTS, SHRUBS AND TREES?

For a tree with textured leaves, I like Liquidambar styraciflua. On the perennials front, Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost', right, has large heart-shaped leaves, which always lift a shady corner.
